School Uniform

Year 11 Uniform 2018/2019

Dear Parents/Guardians.

As in previous years, as a privilege, the uniform for the Year 11 will be a sky blue polo shirt. The embroidered Year 11 black sweatshirt will no longer be available and all students will be expected to wear the existing black sweatshirt, which will need to be purchased through Skoolkit. As you are aware, following consultation with parents last year, a tartan school skirt was made the uniform skirt option. Students were given twelve months to purchase the new style skirts and these are available from Skoolkit. Girls can, of course, still choose to wear either skirts or trousers. The polo shirts can only be ordered through the School. While this uniform is not compulsory, it is hoped that as many Year 11 pupils as possible will choose to wear it. The polo shirts are not available from Skoolkit, Koolskools or John Lewis.

If you would like to order the blue polo shirts, our *preferred method of payment is online, through Thornden School website under the "Parents Tab", where you will have the option to select size and quantity.* (If you are unsure of size, I have a small stock available to look at).

Alternatively, please complete the form below and return to the post box outside the finance office for the attention of Lorraine Rood, with cheque or cash (cheques made payable to Thornden School).

Please bear in mind orders may take up to three weeks to arrive, especially during peak ordering times and will be delivered directly to the pupil.

We will endeavour to have orders, made by the 15th June 2018, available by the end of the summer term. Orders made thereafter may not be received until after the start of the school term in September.

School Payments

Payments to the school may be made via our secure on-line system. Most trips will be made available for payment by this method. If you are experiencing any difficulties paying online, please contact our Finance Department.

We would prefer to receive payments online but if you do need to send in a cheque, please ensure that the name of the pupil and their tutor group is written on the reverse together with what the payment is for. We also accept payment in cash.

Canteen top-ups can also be made online. Cheque payments (cheques payable to "HC3S") should be addressed to the Canteen. The name and tutor group of the pupil should be written on the back of the cheque.



Free School Meals—Changes from 1 April 2018

Beginning in April 2018, the criteria used to determine which pupils are eligible for free school meals will be updated to reflect the introduction of Universal Credit and the phasing out of other income-based benefits.

Below is a letter giving further information from the Department for Education on the changes. Mrs Louise Brown, in our Finance Office, can be contacted at Thornden about free school meals.

Dear Parents/Guardians

Changes to free school meal eligibility under Universal Credit

The eligibility criteria for free school meals have been changed. This letter explains the changes and how they might affect you.

What are the new eligibility criteria?

Children are entitled to receive free school meals if they or their parents or guardians receive any of the benefits below.

- Universal Credit, provided they have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190, as assessed by HMRC
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit



I don't currently claim free school meals - what does this mean for me?

If you think you might be eligible for free school meals, submit a claim to your school or local authority. Your school should have a form you can use. The information you provide will be used to check if you are in receipt of a qualifying benefit and, if you are on Universal Credit, that your earnings do not exceed the threshold. If you claim Universal Credit, your earnings will be assessed from up to three of your last Universal Credit assessment periods.

If you are eligible, your school will be notified. Your child will receive free school meals and the school will receive extra funding.

I am currently claiming free school meals - what does this mean for me?

Most people won't be affected by the new criteria. If you're currently claiming free school meals, but don't' meet the new criteria, your child will continue to receive free school meals until the end of the Universal Credit rollout period. This will apply even if your earnings rise above the new threshold or if you stop being entitled to Universal Credit. The rollout period is currently scheduled to end in March 2022.

Once Universal Credit is fully rolled out, your child will keep their free school meal until the end of their current phase of education, i.e. primary or secondary.


Duke of Edinburgh Award




